First Reading

Acts 10:25-26, 34-35, 44-48

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

As Peter reached the house Cornelius went out to meet him, knelt at his feet and prostrated himself. But Peter helped him up. 'Stand up,' he said 'I am only a man after all!' Then Peter addressed them: 'The truth I have now come to realise' he said (Stand) 'is that God does not have favourites, but that anybody of any nationality who fears God and does what is right is acceptable Gospel Acclamation to him.'

While Peter was still speaking the Holy Spirit came down on Jesus said: 'If anyone loves me he will keep my word, all the listeners. Jewish believers who had accompanied Peter and my Father will love him, and we shall come to him.' were all astonished that the gift of the Holy Spirit should be Alleluia! poured out on the pagans too, since they could hear them speaking strange languages and proclaiming the greatness of Gospel God. Peter himself then said, 'Could anyone refuse the water of baptism to these people, now they have received the Holy Spirit just as much as we have?' He then gave orders for them And with your Spirit. to be baptised in the name of Jesus Christ. Afterwards they begged him to stay on for some days.

You did not choose me, no, I chose you; and I commissioned you to go out and to bear fruit, fruit that will last; and then the Father will give you anything you ask him in my name.
